2026-2027 In Town Bus Stops and Bus Information

Please check your address at the BusRight Portal for the closest bus stop. [BusRight Portal](#) You can then enter this in your registration for the transportation section of questions.

Reminder School Policy is that students will be allowed 1 morning stop and 1 afternoon stop. They do not have to be the same (ex. AM at home; PM at daycare)

New for 2026-2027 there are shaded areas around the Greenfield campus that transportation will not be available. It is the responsibility of the family to arrange transportation for Elementary and High School students in this area.

Greenfield middle school students will NOT ride any of the regular Greenfield bus IN-town stops. They will go to the Greenfield City Park, the South Side Park, or the Greenfield United Methodist Church. They will NOT gather at the high school anymore. Transportation will be available on days that students have events or practices at the school before school.

Fontanelle Shuttle Buses to Greenfield Campus

Students who do not ride an IN-town route, should report to the MS at 7:45 AM; ES and HS students will load Red, Purple, or Black bus and the buses will leave at 7:50AM.

Bus Expectations and Policies

Basic Bus Rules:

- 1) Stay in your seat.
- 2) Use quiet voices.
- 3) Use appropriate language.
- 4) Keep hands, feet, and other objects to yourself.
- 5) No food or drink on the bus without the driver's permission.

Seat Belts

All regular route buses are equipped with standard vehicle seatbelts. All lap-shoulder belts available on district buses will be used by passengers when the vehicle is in any non-stationary gear. Students not wearing seat belts in school vehicles and buses will be subject to the bus write up process outlined in the student handbook.

Bus Incident Procedures

*Prior to beginning this write-up process the driver will have discussed with the student; in many case at least twice; depending on severity of the situation.

(the following is directly copied from all student handbooks. It is the same across all ages using NV Transportation.)

If a student earns a first write-up, the consequence will be a warning along with contacting parents. A copy of a Bus Conduct Report is signed and sent to the student's home. In this case, the student is brought to the principal as soon as possible.

If a student earns a second write-up, the consequence may range from an assigned seat to temporary removal from the bus for no more than three days, along with contacting parents. This suspension can be carried over to the following school year. A copy of a Bus Conduct Report is signed and sent to the student's home. In this case, the student is brought to the principal as soon as possible. A face-to-face conference is scheduled with the student, parent, and school representatives to rectify the situation to avoid additional bus issues.

If a student earns a third write-up, the consequence may range from an assigned seat to temporary removal from the bus for no more than ten days, along with contacting parents. This suspension can be carried over to the following school year. A copy of a Bus Conduct Report is signed and sent to the student's home. In this case, the student is brought to the principal as soon as possible. A face-to-face conference is scheduled with the student, parent, and school representatives to rectify the situation to avoid additional bus issues.

If a student earns a fourth write-up, the consequence may range from a temporary removal from the bus for no more than ten days to an indefinite suspension from the bus. This suspension can be carried over to the following school year. A copy of a Bus Conduct Report is signed and sent to the student's home. In this case, the student is brought to the principal as soon as possible. A face-to-face conference is scheduled with the student, parent, and school representatives to rectify the situation to avoid additional bus issues.

If a student is experiencing problems on the bus, parents should first talk to the driver. If no solution is reached, parents should contact the Principal. In the case a parent is still not satisfied, the Superintendent can be contacted. It would be helpful to enter these conversations with several ways to solve the problem.

All students deserve a safe bus ride to and from school and school activities. Please understand transportation is a service the district provides for students, but is not a right. It is a privilege. School bus drivers, school officials, and families must maintain high levels of safety on buses. Again, consistency is the key. The Administration does reserve the right to administer a stiffer consequence based on the student's actions whether it is a first, second or third write-up.
